CREDIT HOUR REQUIREMENTS

Thesis (30 credit hours); **Non-thesis** (36 credit hours)

All students must complete the core requirements (18 credit hours total). To graduate, those not writing a thesis must take another 18 credits in areas related to their research concentration for a total of 36 credit hours. Those writing a thesis must only take another 12 credits to graduate, or 30 credit hours total. The additional 12 credits must include thesis credits (3 minimum, 6 maximum), and may include additional courses and/or independent study (maximum of 6 credits).
