COVID-19: COLORADO & BEYOND

University students who would like to receive one undergraduate level course credit must attend or view all lectures and submit response papers about each lecture at the end of the series. Students who opt in for credit will be enrolled in the course *ISMA 3000 COVID-19: Colorado & Beyond* for a letter grade. Students should prepare a one-page, 400 to 500-word essay based on the prompt for each of the 12 lectures, and should follow the below rubric:
