1) A personal statement that addresses the following:

- What do you enjoy about teaching writing, or/and what is a core belief that you possess about the teaching of writing? (We believe all teachers, every grade, every discipline, are *teachers of writing*).

- As a result of participating in the Denver Writing Project SI, how are you hoping to grow as a writer? As a teacher of writing?

2) A current resume or CV

Selection Process - Applications will be reviewed by the Director of the Denver Writing Project and decisions will be given promptly. The SI is capped at 12 participants.

Application deadline is *April 1<sup>st</sup> 2025*

The 2025 Summer Institute (SI) will meet on the Auraria Campus at CU Denver for 6 morning sessions: **June 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup> from 9am – 12pm**. Parking costs are covered.

There is a pre-institute, introductory meeting on **Monday, April 7<sup>th</sup> via Zoom from 5pm – 6:30pm**. During this meeting, we will go over program details, set norms, discuss deliverables\*, choose books, and enroll everyone for 3 English, graduate credit hours (ENGL 5110).

\*There are 3 deliverables, items due at the end of the course to receive credit and a grade:

1) A best practice in the teaching of writing that you value shared in the DWP SI group folder, **due June 20<sup>th</sup>**.

2) A personal piece of writing of your choosing, any genre, content of your choosing, **due July 3<sup>rd</sup>**. This could be a writing project that you bring with you this summer, and/or you will see three inspiring presentations by professional writers, so often personal writing comes from these presentations.

3) A professional piece that discusses your core belief/s about the teaching of writing, **due July 3<sup>rd</sup>**.

Eligibility - Educators in any capacity at public or private schools, K-16, any discipline. We seek participants who possess a professional commitment to the teaching of writing and related literacy activities, and a personal commitment to developing as a writer.
