Ethnic Studies is the interdisciplinary study of the historical, political, social, and cultural realities that have shaped the development of America's diverse ethnic populations. Given the interdisciplinary nature of the field, courses draw from a variety of disciplines such as literature, history, political, sociology and cultural studies. The deep and broad focus of Ethnic Studies not only prepares students for understanding the experiences of the various racialized minorities in the United States, but also helps them understand and examine contemporary American society at large, as well as the important continuities and commonalities across other national and racial boundaries. In today's culturally diverse world, a major in Ethnic Studies is a valuable asset and will train students in creative and critical thinking, complex reasoning, and effective communication. In addition, ethnic studies graduates will have cultural competency skills that are highly valued by employers, especially those in sales and service areas. Other occupations that employ many ethnic studies graduates include: teaching, journalism, marketing, public relations, law, community and union organizing, social work, counseling, and public health. Ethnic studies graduates also find work in non-profit agencies and in federal, state and local government agencies.

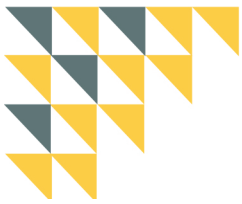
