Job Description: Exciting opportunity to work as an intern in an NIH-funded project focused on addressing disparities in early childhood obesity in Latino populations. This exciting opportunity involves engaging with participating families with toddlers. In this internship you will get trained in human subject's research, assist with data collection doing home visits in both English and Spanish, data entry into REDCap and other study activities as needed.

The principal investigator for this project is Dr. Darcy Thompson.

Work can include the following locations: at the office that is located at the Anschutz Health Sciences Building, at periodic home visits across the Denver metro area for data collection, and /or work from home.

Specific Responsibilities:

- Data collection: Assist a professional research assistant with data collection administering surveys, drop off and pick-up study equipment, teach participants about aspects of the study and use of study equipment, and collect height and weight measurements.
- Data entry: Assist with survey data entry into REDCap

Hours can be somewhat flexible and will depend on study activities. All study activities except for data collection will occur during typical working hours. Data collection activities may involve weekends and evenings. Work will be completed in person at ACCORDS offices.

Opportunities available to learn about different roles in research and about a research career.

Qualifications:

Required

- Applicants must be enrolled in and meet minimum qualifications for PBHL 3939 (junior standing and minimum GPA of 2.0)
- Ability to work independently
- Competent with Microsoft Office software, including Word, Excel, and Outlook.

Preferred

- Experience with data entry
- Experience with REDCap
- Excellent time management and organizational skills
- Flexible and self-motivated
- Bilingual (Spanish/English) preferred for data collection opportunities.

Salary range: This is an unpaid internship associated with PBHL 3939 credit hours.

Hours: 10 to 20 hours per week

Length of internship: Summer months, or up to 6 months.
