### PLANNING COURSEWORK FOR THE 4 + 1 INTS MAJOR WITH POLITICAL SCIENCE MA

# COMPLETE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MAJOR AND SELECT ZONE AND FOCUS AREAS SUITABLE FOR ADVANCED MA COURSEWORK IN POLITICAL SCIENCE

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Students are strongly encouraged to complete all introductory courses before taking additional courses in the major. Students should look at the course offerings on the INTS website and decide how they will balance the coursework between the zone and the focus theme. Students should select a Focus and Zone that will have upper division and MA courses available.

### APPLY TO THE 4+1 MA IN POLITICAL SCIENCE IN JUNIOR YEAR

Students should complete at least 2 Political Science courses in their Zone and Focus, in addition to PSCI 3042 or 3022 from the Introductory courses, by the Fall of their junior year in order to apply to the 4+1 MA in Political Science. In the Spring of Junior year, admitted students should begin taking courses that count toward the BA and MA. Those courses will be at the 5000 level.

### WORK ON BA AND MA DEGREES IN SENIOR YEAR

INTS requires a capstone and at least one high impact project course (internship or service learning). These courses should be taken when the majority of coursework for the major is complete, ideally in the last semester before graduation. Students in the MA in Political Science must also take PSCI 5000 State of the Discipline and PSCI 5486 Research Methods in their senior year. As a result, students should expect that at least one course needed to fulfill the INTS major will be completed during the MA year. Students work with INTS and PSCI advisors to select courses in senior and MA years. Advisors approve all courses that double count for the INTS major and MA.

### MA IN POLITICAL SCIENCE

Students work with Mike Berry, the advisor, to select courses required to complete the MA. The 4+1 MA requires a project in Spring.
