This document specifies degree requirements for undergraduate students in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS) seeking secondary foreign language teacher licensure through the Urban Teacher Education (UEDU) program in the School of Education and Human Development (SEHD). The requirements specified below fulfill all degree and licensure requirements. Students are responsible for knowing and fulfilling all degree requirements. Academic advising is strongly encouraged each semester and is available from the CLAS Advising Office, NC 4002, 303-556-2555.

General Education and UEDU Preparation

49 semester hours

All coursework required to satisfy campus core intellectual competencies, Communicative Skills and Foreign language requires a minimum grade of C- (1.7) and a cum GPA of a 2.75, except UEDU 4930 which requires a minimum grade of B (3.0). Courses with an 'R' prefix are required to meet UEDU admission requirements, and courses with an 'S' prefix are suggested for content breadth essential for secondary Spanish teachers. Students should also meet with the faculty advisor in Spanish designated to work with secondary licensure students, PL 118N, 303-556-4893. Students should complete the UCD Campus Core, CLAS Graduation requirements and UEDU 4930 at the time of application to the UEDU program and/or be registered for the remaining coursework.
