This Spanish Experience is a one-month, six-credit immersion learning experience spent living and studying in Spain. The program is centered for three weeks in the city of Valladolid, whose university (UVA) was founded in the early 13th century by Alfonso VIII, King of Castile. The Centro de Idiomas of the university is well known for its summer Spanish as a Second Language program for foreign students. The classes are held in the Miguel Delibes campus, located about 10 minutes outside of downtown Valladolid. In addition to providing intensive practice in all four language skills in Spanish, this program introduces students to the various facets of contemporary life in Spain as a means of gaining a basic understanding of past and present Spanish society.

Following the academic program in Valladolid, there will be a group trip to Madrid for engagement in cultural activities.
