This document specifies degree requirements for undergraduate students in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS) seeking secondary foreign language teacher licensure through the Urban Teacher Education (UEDU) program in the School of Education and Human Development (SEHD). The requirements specified below fulfill all degree and licensure requirements. Students are responsible for knowing and fulfilling all degree requirements. Academic advising is strongly encouraged each semester and is available from the CLAS Advising Office, NC 4002, 303-556-2555.

General Education and UEDU Preparation

49 semester hours

All coursework required to satisfy campus core intellectual competencies. Communicative Skills and Foreign language requires a minimum grade of C- (1.7) and a cum GPA of a 2.75, except UEDU 4930 which requires a minimum grade of B (3.0). Courses with an 'R' prefix are required to meet UEDU admission requirements, and courses with an 'S' prefix are suggested for content breadth essential for secondary French teachers. Students should also meet with the faculty advisor in the French department designated to work with secondary licensure students, PL 118N, 303-556-4893. Students should complete the UCDCampus core, CLAS Graduation requirements and UEDU 4930 at the time of application to the UEDU program and/or be registered for the remaining coursework.

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Education Internship – 2 sem hr

UEDU4930-2 Education Internship and Seminar – 120 contact hours of internship(s) providing supervised experience with children. As part of the internship experience students are required to attend an on-campus seminar which will provide added support and strategies needed to work with children. A minimum of 12 semester hours with a 2.75 cum GPA must be completed at UC Denver to be eligible to participate in this internship. Minimum grade of B (3.0) is required. Note: Must apply for initial UCTE admission to be eligible for class. Deadlines: Fall – March 15 Spring – October 15			
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Elective Credit

CLAS students must earn a minimum of 120 semester hours to be awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree in French. With successful completion of the General Education, French major requirements and the IPTE Secondary Licensure courses, students may be required to complete additional coursework to meet the minimum 120 semester hours.

French Major

CLAS students seeking secondary foreign language licensure with a major in French must complete 30 semester hours of upper-division coursework in French. Students should meet with the faculty advisor in French designated to work with secondary licensure students (Plaza 118N, 303-556-4893). The BA in French requires that a minimum of 18 semester hours be taken at CU-Denver, and that the minimum grade for each course applied to the major be a 'C' (2.0). The GPA in all courses applied to a French major must be a 2.5. At least 9 of the 30 semester hours must be taken at the 4000 level. No courses taken on a pass/fail basis may be credited toward a French Major or Minor. The following list of courses for the major should be used as a guide. Please see the assigned faculty advisor in French for the most current list of requirements.

CLAS students are required to complete the UEDU Secondary Education Licensure courses with a minimum grade of "B" 3.0 in all UEDU courses. Special Note: a minimum grade of B (3.0) is required for remaining UEDU Internships. Students can transfer a maximum of 9 credits of teacher licensure courses. Transfer courses must be approved by the SEHD. Students must successfully pass the PLACE content test when applying to the program.
