



Therefore, I, Jared Polis, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby proclaim, May 1, 2021, as




You have persevered and produced great work. You achieved an incredible feat—studying history while being a part of a monumental historical event. You have earned this incredible experience! We are so proud of you!

**Preliminary Rounds Judging:** Judging and interviews for the National History Day in Colorado State Contest will take place in a hybrid format. Documentaries, websites, and papers will take place virtually via Zoom from 9:00 am to around 1:00 pm.

**Final Rounds Judging:** The majority of categories will have final rounds, EXCEPT junior performances, senior performances, and senior group websites. There are no interviews in Final Rounds. Students DO NOT need to be present for Final Rounds in any category, either virtually or inperson.

The Awards Ceremony will be livestreamed at 5:00 pm on Saturday, May 1 on facebook.com/cohistoryday. Final results will also be posted on the homepage of National History Day in Colorado after the awards ceremony.


