
RESPONSIBILITIES



Founded in 1873 in Golden, Colorado by Adolf Coors, the Coors Brewing Company is the largest single brewing facility in the world. Promoting the distribution of their pilsner-style beer, the brewer survived Prohibition, turning to porcelain production and malted milk used to make candy. Coors prides itself on its environmentally friendly policies, creating the first aluminum can, now the world's largest can manufacturer.



Fannie May Duncan

Born in 1918, Fannie May moved to Colorado with her mother and siblings in 1933 and was the first in her family to earn a high school diploma.

As an entrepreneur, philanthropist, and activist, **Fannie May Duncan founded** the Cotton Club, promoting inclusion among multi-ethnic groups in Colorado Springs, fostering integration during the Civil Rights era.



Denver Health Founded in 1860, Denver Health was the first hospital established in the Denver metro region, breaking ground at the corners of 8th Avenue and Lawrence Street. Meeting the needs of people moving west in the 19th century, the cost of a visit was only .75 cents per day. Today, Denver Health is recognized as a leading provider of medical care in the Rocky Mountain region.

Every public school shall be open between the ages of five and twenty-one years, residing in that district without the payment of

Born in 1833 in New Mexico, Ouray's childhood was spent in indentured servitude to wealthy landowners. In 1851. Ourav moved to Colorado. In 1859, he married Chipeta, an Apache women raised by the Southern Ute tribe. Serving as a representative for the Ute people, Ouray negotiated many treaties with the **United States government** including the Treaty of 1864, the Brunot Agreement, and the Treaty of 1880 all ending in the reduction of Ute lands across

Incorporated under Colorado law in 1910, Mrs. Jean founded the DDFL to serve as a shelter for stray dogs in Denver. In 1974, the Quebec Street Shelter opened to meet the growing animal welfare need in the Denver metro area. Today, the DDFL has affiliate locations across Colorado, from the Equine Center in Franktown to the Veterinary Hospital in Yuma county.

Colorado Compulsory School **Attendance Law**

First signed into law in 1963, and revised over a dozen times since, the 2022 revisions of the Colorado Compulsory School Attendance law require schools to open their admission tuition free to children ages 5-21 years of age. Compulsory attendance for children ages 6-17 is required under
