The Department of Philosophy will fund and administer up to **1** scholarship each academic year for undergraduate students at the CU Denver. Recipients will receive **\$1,000**.

The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage students to take philosophy courses and to practice the skills philosophy fosters in a world that is in great need of philosophy and philosophers.

Eligibility and criteria:

Any student currently declared a CU Denver philosophy major, philosophy minor, ethics minor or any other CU Denver student that is currently enrolled in at least their third course in philosophy at CU Denver. Students must have completed a minimum of 15 credit hours at CU Denver.

Preference will be given to applicants who:

- Currently declared as a CU Denver philosophy major, philosophy minor, ethics minor
- Have a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.25 or higher
- Are enrolled for at least six credit hours during the current semester

- A current CU Denver unofficial transcript.
- A typed (double-spaced) 500-700 word essay explaining the impact philosophy has had, does have, or will have upon your life and the lives of others outside of your academic studies. Your essay will be blind reviewed. Focus your essay on one of the following three areas:

A.) Ethics in Action

B.) Philosophy in Social Action

C.) Impact of Philosophy in Everyday Life.

Decisions will be made by May 15th. The Department of Philosophy reserves the right not to award a scholarship for any given semester should the evaluating committee judge that no applications merit it.
