In a typical day, an Intern will engage in the following activities:

- Provide support to ULC staff in pursuing real estate acquisition opportunities by assisting with the feasibility analysis of potential real estate development transactions
- Participate in site inspections and other field work. Conduct research for complex community developments within Metro Denver
- Perform due diligence activities, as directed, including investigation of zoning requirements, title issues, environmental conditions
- Review local jurisdiction land planning and building codes for creative solutions to expand development opportunities
- Perform financial analysis (pro forma) to determine feasibility of various development concepts
- Communicate with supervisor and other team members regarding critical issues impacting property opportunities
- Meet with public officials, financial investors, private developers, housing advocates and others in order to create, preserve and expand community assets
- Assist development staff to prepare presentations for committee review
- Assist with other related tasks, as required,
