

## **Prepositions**

Prepositions connect nouns and pronouns to other words in a sentence in terms of location, time, or logic. A prepositional phrase begins with a preposition and ends with a noun, which is the object of the preposition. Thus, the preposition links the object of the preposition in space, time, or logic to a previous noun or pronoun.

## **Locative (location)**

The Writing Center is **on** the fourth floor.

In the above example, "on" is the preposition linking "Writing Center" (the noun) to "fourth floor" (object of the preposition) and describes a spatial relationship between "Writing Center" and its location. The prepositional phrase is "on the fourth floor."

## Temporal (time)

My doctor's appointment is **in** the morning.

In this example, "in" is the preposition linking "appointment" (the noun) to "morning" (object of the preposition) and describes a temporal relationship, or when the appointment will occur. The prepositional phrase is "in the morning."

## **Logical (other relationships)**

I bought a new car **for** my mom.

Here, "for" is the preposition linking "car" (the noun) to "my mom" (object of the preposition) and describes a logical relationship between "car" and "mom." The prepositional phrase is "for my mom."
